Report a safeguarding adults concern



Everyone has the right to live free from abuse and neglect.

Safeguarding means protecting the rights of adults at risk to live free from abuse and neglect or the risk of it.



An Adult at Risk is someone who:

- 1. Has care and support needs
- 2. Is at risk of experiencing abuse and neglect
- 3. Is unable to protect themselves from either the risk of or experience of abuse and neglect. This is because of their care and support needs.
