Literary Landscape

Re your plan "to develop and promote sustainable tourism that respects the Bronte heritage of Haworth...", we feel the unique Bronte moorland, as well as village, heritage needs more foregrounding in all planning decisions.

With reference to your welcome focus on safeguarding the "local landscape typology" of the South Pennine/Haworth area - bringing together cultural and biodiversity heritage - as residents for 37 years, my husband and I feel that an increasing threat exists from within the current landscape management itself, rather than just from tourism or housing development.

We feel this may not be sufficiently scrutinised in your future plans as they stand.

Some management activities are threatening the unique landscape aesthetic and accessibility of a world-famous moorland which attracts local, national and international visitors, is host to the Pennine and Bronte Ways and has the most famous literary associations of any landscape in Britain (thanks to Bronte associations) .

Nowhere was more important to the Bronte family, and the nurturing of their artistic genius, than the moorland areas around Haworth, Oakworth, Stanbury, Widdop, Alcomden, Crow Hill and Dovestones.

Its bio-health, peace and beauty is vital to all of us who live and work on it, however small our businesses, voices and influence, as well as to the experiences of those who visit it, inspired by the Bronte (and Ted Hughes/Sylvia Plath) novels and poetry.

Vested private landscape management interests accompanied by large amounts of money / subsidy must not be allowed to turn these moors into mono-cultures, at the expense of a vital and inspirational amenity for Bradford's people and for the world.

(We are sad to learn the Council is given no jurisdiction over heather-burning, which as well as threatening bio-diversity, is an environmental hazard for our local towns and the city of Bradford)
