With reference to 'Chapter 5.5 Minerals' we support Policies EN10 and EN11 which states that Bradford MDC, in conjunction with other Minerals Planning Authorities within West Yorkshire, seek to contribute to the maintenance of a landbank of at least 10 years supply of crushed rock aggregate reserves and at least 7 years supply of sand and gravel reserves, as calculated through the West Yorkshire Local Aggregates Assessment.

Although there is no specific data available it is likely that significant amounts of Aggregate are exported to the West Yorkshire Sub-region, including the Bradford MDC Plan area, from the North Yorkshire Plan area. Future supply of Aggregate from North Yorkshire is currently uncertain, however all options within our recently published Issues and Options Consultation Document support the continued supply of Aggregate, including for export.
