Climate Change and Resource Use

There is a broad set of laudable goals here which we would support, but no meaningful targets for how to achieve them or how rapidly. Without targets there is no sense of the scale of the task and therefore insufficient weight will be given to this policy in comparison to other policies.

In particular, the second outcome of the policy is that *“The District will continue to adapt successfully to the predicted impacts of climate change”*. That there are no indicators or targets against this outcome highlights the absence of genuine evidence of how successfully the District is already adapting, and the lack of any way to measure progress against the policy.

Consequently the policy is neither positively prepared nor effective.
