The Local Infrastructure Plan (LIP) makes short shrift for infrastructure improvement in Bradford.

- The LIP is not capable of retaining much green or developed land (council & other planning to build 200 houses in Arthington (in AOS))
- Section 106 LIP were found NOT to be consistent with local planning policies regarding capacity, with Ilkley being a prime example.
- The LIP does not plan any infrastructure into areas.
- A large area of unpopulated land has no realistic need to develop - Ilkley is a counter例 - even now there is no plan for an even 3 weeks journey time.
- Businesses are being encouraged to move into Ilkley but other areas than Congleton will encourage this.
- Parkway - currently inadequate parking for commercial, retail + residential & therefore attracting well connected firms (land for parking is scarce).
- Towns - relatively over crowded at rush hour. No committed funding for increasing rail links - little focus for increasing bus (eg off peak) provision - ^{station} (bus) prioritised at rush hour.

School 5 Review

- Schools - Primary schools in areas very poorly maintained.
- Perfect Comm recognition seek to increase this, cleaner operating, and an easier environment.
This is now listed as a potential site for new.
 - + The LF recognises strengths of school, areas could pose significant challenges to learning growth yet has no prospect.
 - Extra funding will lead to better physical facilities, although the unaffordable (addition) w/ extra cost but of negative impact on environment.

- There has been no attempt to assess local need
- The strategy sets out positive measures for minimising green belt releases, valuing green infrastructure, protecting habitats, minimising additional travel arising from development, housing tourism - all of which are at odds with the scale of building proposed.
- Planning numbers have been reduced on account of a slight but by only 38% in Libby's view continued reduction across rest of Bradford of 56%.
- The whole of Libby's new houses within the 2.5km Hutton protected zone
- no account is taken of Libby's freely unique home-building profile - re-development of properties has already seen ~500 new houses since 2014 - those are excluded from calculations
- At least 5% of Libby's new houses will be built on green belt. - This goes against the Government National Planning Policy Framework that aims to prevent towns merging who are otherwise
