	Project A – DIF - Victoria Hotel			
	The terms of the Grant Funding Agreement (GFA) have been agreed, awaiting the final schedules from the project team ahead of signing.	Noted		
	Project H – Keighley Association for Women and Childrens Centre (KAWACC)			
	Sale of the building to KAWACC has been completed. The GFA is in the final stages before signing.			
	Project J – Community, Health & Wellbeing Centre			
	The three principal partners (Bradford District and Craven Health and Care Partnership (BDCHCP), Airedale NHS Foundation Trust and Bradford Council) have progressed discussions over recent months on the Keighley Health and Wellbeing Centre (KHWBC).			
	The partners met in August and agreed that the KHWBC development remains a key priority, with partners committed to collaborating to find a suitable route to deliver the project.			
	Airedale NHS Foundation Trust has confirmed that KHWBC is a priority as part of the overall new build hospital project plans for Airedale, with having more local community-based services being an important element of the operational model for the new Airedale hospital.			
	Bradford District and Craven Health and Care Partnership has confirmed that the provision of a KHWBC is a key priority that would enable community based services, including primary care services, mental health services and voluntary sector services to be provided in a truly integrated way, improving access to services for the local population and helping to address the significant health inequalities that exist in Keighley.			
	The partners have been able to identify meaningful capital funding opportunities to be explored for the KHWBC. Over the coming months, the partners intend to revisit the scope of the proposed KHWBC to agree measurable outcomes for the scheme and test the deliverability of a project within the

	available capital funding envelope. This exercise will also consider parameters for operating and delivery model options. A workshop is scheduled for October for the key stakeholders, after which more details including indicative timescales hope to be shared with the board.			
	All partners are aware of the funding time constraints, for Towns Fund the grant should be spend before March 2028. Noted that new guidance from MHCLG has extended period for grant expenditure and seen merging of Towns Fund and LUF into new Local Regeneration Fund.			
	Noted in due course the need to communicate with the public, on timescales, scope, and community consultation with NHS. This will be informed by progress made with partners over coming months.

	Thrive Economics joined the meeting to walk board through progress on Regeneration Plan. Plan is 60—70% complete and draft (shared prior to meeting) will remain open for board members comments for another week.			
	Vision – Discussion on whether the vision was too generic to be unique to Keighley. Suggestions to include the balance of urban and rural, include more about nature, more on heritage (Brontes, moorlands, gateway to the Dales), and keywords such as manufacturing, literature, making, creating, entrepreneurs, young people, education, skills.			
	Keighley College carried out a survey of their students, responses of which will be made available to Thrive Economics to review.			
	Challenges – noted the crime figures included are a few years old, focus of local police has been on reducing the crime against women/ girls/ serious crime. Information should be included on local intervention measures. A discussion can be held with the community partnership.
