Digital Forms

'Digital Forms' is the new name for iApply – the system that will be used for you to apply for new/renewal licences on-line. The name of the software has been changed by the supplier, but this has not changed how it looks.

Information and training sessions will be held in various places across the district throughout October and November; these sessions are designed to help you access and learn about the system. You'll be able to have a go at using the on-line application forms, uploading documents and see what the response email looks like. We would like as many people as possible to attend the sessions so you are prepared when the system becomes available to everyone in January 2020.

We will be sending more information regarding specific dates and venues in the next few weeks. We look forward to seeing you in October & November!



Vehicle Proprietor Application Form

We have been running an online renewal process for your Private Hire and Hackney Carriage Drivers Licence for some time now; we are delighted to announce that on Monday 5th August 2019 we launched the online facility for you to apply for a new/renewal vehicle licence.

You will be sent a reminder to your registered email address 6 weeks before the expiry date of your current licence.

When you are completing the online application form for renewal vehicles, you will need to upload a copy of your logbook (V5) and valid insurance. If you are applying for a new vehicle licence you will need to upload your logbook or new keepers slip and email your insurance to taxi.testing@bradford.gov.uk at least 3 working days before your vehicle inspection.

Not completing any of the steps mentioned above may result in a delay to licensing your vehicle.

Declaration of Cautions, Convictions and Penalty Points

It is against the law for a new applicant not to declare any cautions, convictions or penalty points on their legally binding Statutory Declaration. It is also a condition of licence that all licenced Private Hire and Hackney Carriage Drivers must report any cautions, convictions and penalty points they receive to the Service, within 7 days.

The Suitablilty Policy that has been in place since 1st March 2019 is used by the Service when assessing the fitness and propriety of all drivers.

Air Quality

As part of the West Yorkshire Conbined Authority Air Quality development plans there are 88 electric vehicle rapid-charging points being installed across West Yorkshire, 20 of which will be in Bradford.

On Friday 2nd August 2019 the first two charging points were opened on Vicar Lane in the top car park. There are more locations to follow within the Bradford District.

Each of the locations will have two electric charging points. One of these will be dedicated for Hackney Carriage and Private Hire use only as they will have ability to provide rapid charging, free until 29th October 2021.

On Tuesday 23rd July 2019 the Licensing Service held an Open Invitation day for all Operators and Proprietors to come down and look around 2 fully electric vehicles that were being showcased. These vehicles were the Nissan ENV200 and a TX the new electric taxi. The demonstration was very well attended and received by the trade.

Plate Collection

The plate collection in the workshop is going really well and the Service is continuously receiving positive feedback from the drivers. Everyone attending Shearbridge is stating they prefer collecting their plates straight after their test.

There are two things that require some improvement as they have resulted in the plates not being collected straight after the vehicle inspection.

- 1) No insurance has been sent in for new vehicles. When booking a new vehicle all drivers are advised that we need a copy of the insurance certificate at least 3 days before the vehicle inspection date to ensure that plates can be collected on the same day.
- 2) Drivers are arriving for their vehicle test with no badge. Please remember that it is a legal requirement for all drivers to wear their badge at all times when driving a licenced vehicle.

The above examples are simple things that can be avoided. Remembering these will mean you will not need to return to Shearbridge to collect your plates.

Online Application Forms

The Service is streamlining the services it offers to all licensed personnel. To progress this, the Service has introduced two new electronic forms that can be used to inform us of changes.

Change of Address – So you can notify the Service easily if you change your address you will now use the new online form. Before you start completing the new online form make sure you have your driving licence with your new address as this will need to be uploaded before the form can be submitted. Change of Operator – When you wish to change the operator you work for, or to add any additional operators to your existing badge, you will now use the new electronic form. Before you start completing the new online form make sure you have a letter from the new operator you wish to work for as this will need to be uploaded before the form can be submitted. 
Advice from the Enforcement Team on Part Worn Tyres

Are Part Worn tyres worth the cost?

As a licenced driver you are on the road for the majority of your day and you travel more miles than a regular road user, therefore it essential that your vehicle is safe for both you and your passengers.

Many people think they are getting a bargain when purchasing a part worn tyre, however, when purchasing a tyre you should consider the cost per mm of useable tyre rather than the initial cost.

New tyres are sold with 8-10mm of tread whereas part worn tyres may have as little as 2mm. The legal tread depth is 1.6mm which means in the long run a part worn tyre may work out more expensive for you. With the mileage you cover on a daily basis the tread on a part worn tyre is not likely to last that long meaning a new tyre would have to be purchased leading to additional cost to drivers.







Part worn tyre safety

As a licenced driver it is your responsibility to ensure that your vehicle is safe to carry fare paying passengers.

The tread depth on a tyre is essential for safe driving on wet roads. It is the tread on tyres that disperses water from the road allowing a better grip. As we all know, the weather in the UK is rather unpredictable so it is better to be prepared and purchase tyres with a decent tread depth as this will increase safety and reduce stopping distances.

Run Flat Tyres

Run flat tyres are designed to allow road users to continue their journey for a limited amount of time even after they have received a puncture. These tyres are fitted with a reinforced sidewall to hold the weight of the car when the tyre pressure drops; and will last up to another 50 miles before the tyre needs replacing.

Bradford MDC do allow licensed vehicles to have run flat tyres fitted, if their vehicle is equipped with a Tyre Pressure Monitoring System (TPMS) and the tyre is correct for that specific vehicle.

The TPMS alerts the driver in the event of a puncture, or if the tyre pressure drops below a certain level. Using a run flat tyre on a vehicle that is not equipped with a TPMS would be highly dangerous and may cause a serious accident.

The two main reasons a vehicle may fail an inspection for tyres resulting in a serious defect and incurring a £100 retest fee are;

- •The vehicle has run flat tyres fitted but the vehicle is not equipped with a TPMS
- •The vehicle is equipped with a TPMS but the run flat tyres that are fitted are not correct for that vehicle.
