3	Minutes of last meeting and matters arising	<ul> <li>PA accepted minutes from February meeting.</li> <li>Consultation with WYCA (West Yorkshire Combined Authority)</li> <li>PA: Could you please explore how the LAF is to be notified of proposals for projects that emanate from the combined authority please?</li> <li>DM: Noted that the consultation programme for Steeton/Silsden bridge was too late in including user groups – scheme had progressed too far before groups were able to give their input.</li> <li>EY: Email to WYCA - to include Local Access Forum as consultee on WYCA schemes in the future (to be included at an early enough stage of the scheme).</li> <li>Steeton/ Silsden bypass bridge (update presentation by James Luckman at February meeting)</li> <li>PA: Still in communication with JL, not happy with reasoning for excluding equestrians, progressing.</li> </ul>

Funding from the Government is to include all users but the scheme has excluded a group.</li> <li>DJ: WYCC weren't aware of the LAF but should be as the LAF is a statutory body.</li> <li>Wharfedale Greenway</li> <li>PA: results taken to RAF.
