1	Welcome and Apologies The Chair welcomed everyone to the meeting, apologies were noted.			
	JH was introduced as the Programme Manager who will be taking over from MR who is leaving the council.

3	Declaration of Interests No further declarations of interest were made			
4	Towns Fund Updates: Project A – Development Investment Fund Providence Park This is on schedule to be completed by October 2024 with most of the units close to being built. Beechcliffe Site MR provided an update regarding this scheme, including progress and risks. A Project Adjustment Request (PAR) will be required for the Beechcliffe site due to a reduction in sq m industrial space, alongside a reduction in outputs as residential units were included in the original Monitoring & Evaluation Plan.			
	Victoria Hotel There are delivery options being explored, as per the board papers, however, the board raised the query of utilising some spend to ensure the building is water-tight, alongside any interest in retailers for the ground floor. The board also expressed concerns regarding the deliverability of the scheme and associated challenges.	Provide an update at the next board.	Council Officers / MHCLG	Dec-24



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	Project B – Town Centre & Infrastructure Improvements Low Street Phase 2 has been completed and the Connectivity Study was covered at the last board meeting. This is still at consultation stage and will help to inform the options going forward.			
	The public realm improvements will be determined by the Connectivity Study, which will help to determine the key priorities for this scheme. DP indicated that there was no consultation on the Connectivity Study with the railway.	Refer DP to Alex Herd	Council Officers (MR)	Oct-24
	The Active Travel Scheme update was provided with Thwaites Brow complete and other phases being reviewed. The Real Time Bus Information work has also been completed.			
	Community Grants Scheme MR provided an update as per the board papers. This includes projects that have been completed, including Scott Street, Haworth Toilets where the underspend was utilised on further work. Sangat Centre has also been completed and a press release issued. Old School Room and Central Hall have also been fully completed.			
	Keighley Cougars project is at risk, due to the designs being over- budget. A redesign based on the redevelopment of the main stand will go out to tender once the financial due diligence has been completed and funding released. Planning for this has been resubmitted and a decision will be made in early November.			
	Haworth Village Hall are looking at going out to tender, with funding to be released shortly. This will allow finalised costings for the development. The risk rating for this project can be reviewed once tender process has been completed.	Review risk rating for this project	Council Officers	Dec-24
	Woodville Activity Centre project has started with site clearance and construction taking place. There has been strong community involvement and outputs for volunteer hours will exceed the target. TR confirmed that they had won an award at the Keighley Business Awards and echoed the success of the project.			
	Good Shepherd Centre will move forward as an application has been submitted and funding is expected to be released.			
	Keighley Worth Valley Railway the water tank house has been completed and open to the public. There is some work to do to improve the interpretation offer. The Water Tank itself needs to be relining and external funding has been acquired for repairs. The Haworth elements of the project have been delayed due to the works on Bridge 27 (replacement of the bridge using £1m COF money) which is now			



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	operational. The Old Parcels Office 'pub' is due to also open on 04/10/24 with an event planned over the weekend.		Owner	Date
	Project C – Keighley Skills Hub This was originally due to be located at the Health Centre, however, a decision was taken by Luminate Education Group to review alternative options, including a potential move into the Creative Arts Hub. Further investigative work is taking place to check whether the building is structurally sound to construct a mezzanine. A PAR will be needed for a change of location.			
	Project D – Manufacturing, Engineering & Future Technology Hub The Grant Funding Agreement and Agreement to Lease has been signed and some funds have been released to progress the project. They will be located at Unit C in Providence Park and due to open in January 2025. Risk rating to review for this project.	Risk rating to review for this project	Council Officers	Dec-24
	Project E – Capital Assistance to Business Growth RP provided an update on this scheme, including the approvals to date. A PAR maybe required to reduce the number of businesses supported, however the team managing the programme are reviewing these options. GW indicated a summary of the type of businesses being supported and their sector would be useful to understand.	Summary of the businesses being supported	Council Officers	Dec-24
	Project F – Creative Arts Hub This is at RIBA 3 and ESA (Project Leads) are reviewing designs with the input of Keighley Creative and Keighley College. A structural engineer is working with Frasers Structural Engineer to determine whether the building can accommodate the mezzanine. Discussions to agree the GFA are ongoing.			
	Project H – Women Employment Programme There is a current shortfall in funding to deliver this project, with alternative options being explored. KAWACC are looking to purchase the building and have had a valuation on the building and repriced the works with the preferred contractor. The project is at risk and the council cannot enter into an agreement until the deliverability of this scheme can be demonstrated. The board expressed concerns regarding whether this could be delivered within the timescales of the Towns Fund, including offers of support to help progress and adjust the project.			
	Project I – Keighley Art & Film Festival A range of events have been delivered which has resulted in footfall increasing within the town centre. The team are looking at matchfunding to deliver further events.			



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	Project J – Community, Health & Wellbeing Centre This project is at risk due to a funding gap where a viable route to acquire further funds is needed. A planning pre-application has been made and a project board has been setup. Discussions are ongoing with third party developers have indicated that options are currently not feasible, so discussion are taking place to review ways this can be delivered. TR indicated that services from the hospital could be delivered through the Health & Wellbeing Centre whilst the new hospital is being built. ARS has met with the NHS team and reviewing the viability gap, including ways it can be delivered. There are strong outputs, including jobs and the opportunity to create a wider benefit to Keighley.
