

<p>Activity: Raise awareness about air pollution a creative exercise. posters.</p>	<p>Key Vocabulary: Awareness, pollution, air quality.</p>
<p>Warm up</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Recap what we learnt last lesson. • What did we find out about how polluted air effects health and environment 	
<p>Activity</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Did you know this before you learnt about it? Talk about how it is important to raise awareness, so others also know about pollution and importance of air quality. • Provide poster boards, markers, and other art supplies. • Ask each group to create a poster about air quality, including what it is, why it's important, and how to monitor it. 	
<p>Plenary</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Share your posters with the class and display around school. <p>(maybe invite the parents to school and have an assembly/presentation on the children's findings)</p>	
<p>Additional Tips:</p> <p>Safety: Ensure all outdoor activities are supervised and that children are aware of safety protocols.</p> <p>Adaptation: Adjust the complexity of the content and activities based on the age and comprehension level of the students.</p> <p>Interactive Elements: Incorporate more interactive elements like games or quizzes if time allows.</p> <p>Follow-up: Consider a follow-up lesson on steps everyone can take to improve air quality.</p>
