



Walkable Distance from Providers

This analysis illustrates the accessibility of HAF providers across Bradford district based on walkable distances from provider locations. By applying 15-minute walk isochrones, the analysis estimates the proportion of FSM-eligible children with convenient access to a nearby provider.

With a 74% coverage, the findings demonstrate strong coverage across the district, suggesting that the majority of eligible children had a provider within easy walking distance — supporting equitable access and reducing transport-related barriers to participation.



Density of Activities



Activity Distribution Analysis


This section highlights when activities took place and the types delivered during the 2024 HAF programme.

This graph represent the total number of activities on each day during each HAF programme.




POPULAR ACTIVITY TYPE

This graph represent the total number of activities for each type of activity.




Event Host Provider Activity Distribution

This graph represent the total number of activities for each starting time.








HIGHEST ACTIVITY END TIMING

This graph represent the total number of activities for each ending time.






Heatmap of Participants Location
















Travel Distances to Providers

This page highlights how far participants needed to travel to access activities organised in their area. The pie chart categorises participants by walking distance—ranging from within 5 minutes to outside typical walking distance. A significant proportion of attendees lived within a short walk, indicating good local access to activities.

On the right, the map visualises travel proximity by ward. Darker shades represent wards where participants lived closer to activity locations, while lighter shades indicate areas where participants had to travel further. This information helps assess accessibility and can guide future planning to ensure activities are more evenly distributed and reachable for all communities.


